Based upon consultations and deliberations, the <u>Dean of Law</u> will present a report and recommendation regarding the name of the building to Principal and Vice-Chancellor Patrick Deane. Principal Deane will consider this report while formulating his own recommendation, which he will submit to the <u>Board of Trustees</u>. Queen's Board has authority over university building names and will review Principal Deane's recommendation at a meeting in October.
